

Diagnosis and management of head and neck lumps

Dr Muzib Abdul-Razak MFRCSE, FRACS, MCh (Surgical Oncology)

Radiotherapy in the management of head and neck cancers

Dr Andrew Fong is a radiation oncologist at the Sydney Adventist Hospital. He was the 2009 RANZCR Withers and Peters Fellow, and has interests in head, neck and lung cancer. He specialises in advanced radiotherapy techniques such as Tomotherapy and established the stereotactic ablative body radiotherapy (SABR) program at Radiation Oncology Centres.

Consultant radiation oncologist together with oncology nurses will guide GPs through the patient experience of chemotherapy and radiation treatment for head and neck cancer. So that GPs can provide up-to-date patient advice on radiation and chemotherapy, GPs will visit the Day Infusion and Radiation Oncology departments to see advances in patient care and treatment. The guides will outline the common concerns and side-effects of treatment and how these can be managed in a GP setting.
