Palliative care perspectives

14-15 March or 15-16 September 2016

A foundation level course on aspects of palliative care for people with a life-limiting illness from the perspective of a specialist palliative care multi-disciplinary team.

Participants will be introduced to both physical and psychosocial aspects of care for patients with palliative care needs and their families, with a focus on needs assessment strategies.

For health professionals in acute, chronic, aged care and/ or palliative care settings with limited palliative care knowledge or experience.

Advance Care Planning

Friday 15 April or Friday 23 September 2016

A workshop in advance care planning, including ethical principles and capacity issues relevant to this process.

Participants will have the opportunity to enhance their understanding of communication strategies and reflect on some of the complex issues that influence peoples decisions in advance care planning processes.

For health professionals in acute, chronic, aged care and/or palliative care settings who are providing care to people with a life-limiting illness and/or their caregivers.

Management of Symptoms in Advanced Illness

21-22 April or 13-14 October 2016

A foundational level course providing an overview of the more common symptoms experienced by patients with advanced illness. Participants will have the opportunity to enhance their knowledge in the identification and management of complex symptoms in patients with life limiting diseases.

For health professionals in acute, chronic, aged care and/or palliative care settings who are providing care to people with a life-limiting illness and/or their caregivers.

Introduction to Grief & Bereavement

23 May 2016

An introductory course on the processes of bereavement and the experiences of bereaved people. Facilitated by a specialist bereavement counsellor this course explores issues related to loss and grief. It covers a range of strategies in dealing with bereavement and the experiences of bereaved people in the period after death has occurred.

For health professionals, care workers and others who work with people following a death.

Psychological Care for people who are Bereaved

22 August 2016

An advanced level course on current theories of bereavement and diagnostic issues related to bereavement and co-morbidity and treatment considerations when working with people who are bereaved.

For Psychologists and other mental health specialists working with people who are bereaved, in a variety of care settings.

Communication Skills in working with Bereaved People

24 October 2016

An intermediate course for those in the helping professions who work with people where bereavement issues are an underlying factor in presentation. The course will be led by a specialist bereavement counsellor.

It would be helpful for participants to have previously attended the one day course 'Introduction to Grief & Bereavement'. For health professionals, care workers and others who work with people following a death.
