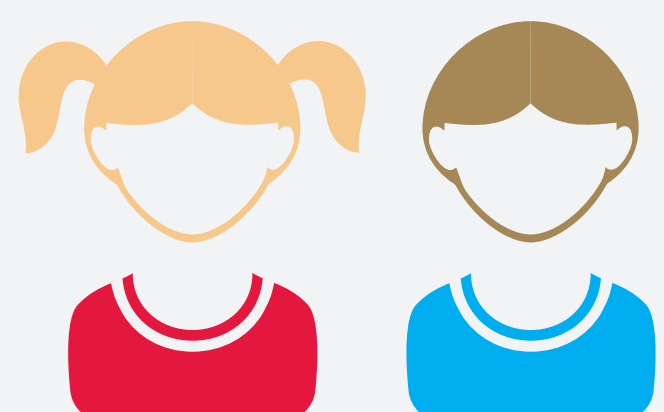


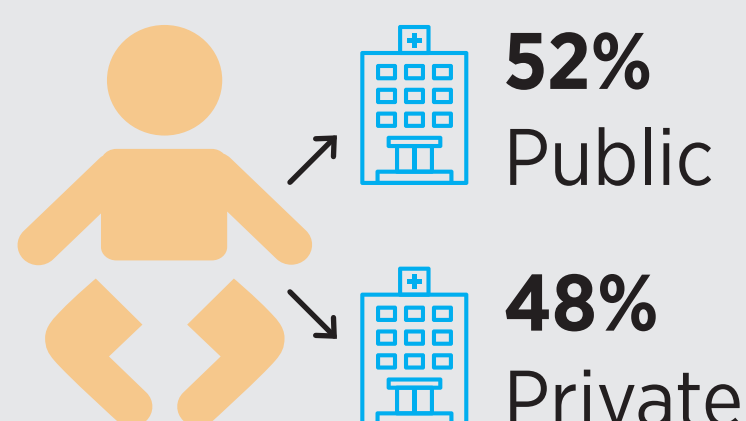

Children In Their First Year of School:

- 17.2% have 1 Developmental Vulnerability
- 6% have 2 Developmental Vulnerabilities

Mt Colah (2079)
Children In Their First Year of School:

- 29.9% have 1 Developmental Vulnerability
- 13.4% have 2 Developmental Vulnerabilities

Eastwood (2122)
Children In Their First Year of School:

- 28.5% have 1 Developmental Vulnerability
- 15.0% have 2 Developmental Vulnerabilities

In 2015-2016:

49,873 0-16 yr olds presented to NSLHD Emergency Departments. This represents a 25% of all presentations.

22,132 of these were in the 0-4 yr age group. This is 44% of all Paediatric presentations.



20,700 mothers attended Education Group Sessions at Child and Family Health Centres in 2016
