



HORNSBY LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREA HEALTH PROFILE

Hornsby Local Government Area (LGA) is one of 9 LGAs in the Sydney North Health Network (SNHN) region.

Key Areas: Obesity, a large culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) population, and an ageing population

HEALTH DRIVERS

Hornsby LGA is an affluent area, ranking in the least disadvantaged quintile (20%) on the index of relative socio-economic disadvantage. There is a small area of comparatively high socio-economic disadvantage in the suburbs of Castle Hill and Normanhurst.

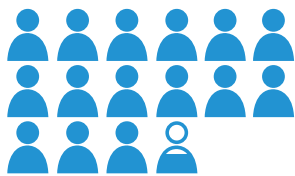
CANCER SCREENING

Bowel cancer screening participation rate among people aged **50-74 in Hornsby (38.4%)** is similar to the SNHN (38.6%) rate and higher than the NSW (35.4%) rate.

Cervical cancer screening participation rate among women aged **20-69 years (60.1%)** is higher than the NSW rate (55.9%) and lower than the SNHN rate (62.7%).

Breast cancer screening participation rate among women aged **50-74 in Hornsby (43.4%)** is higher than the SNHN rate (41.8%) and lower than the NSW (46.1%) rate.

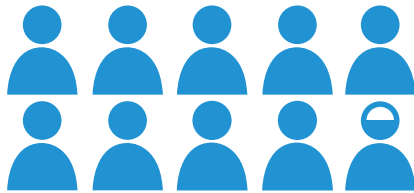

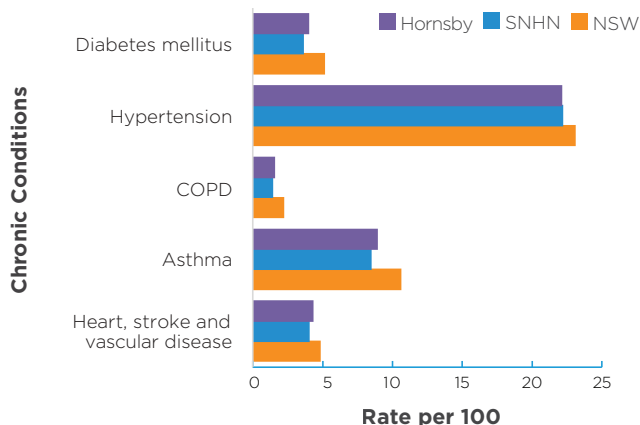

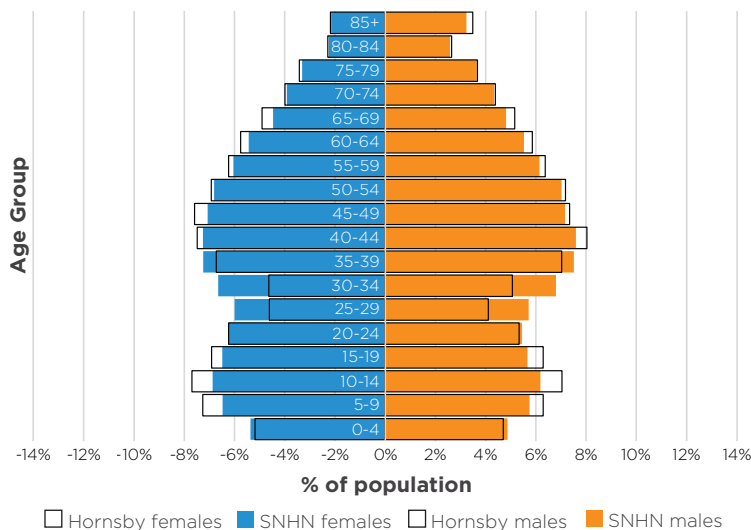

CALD

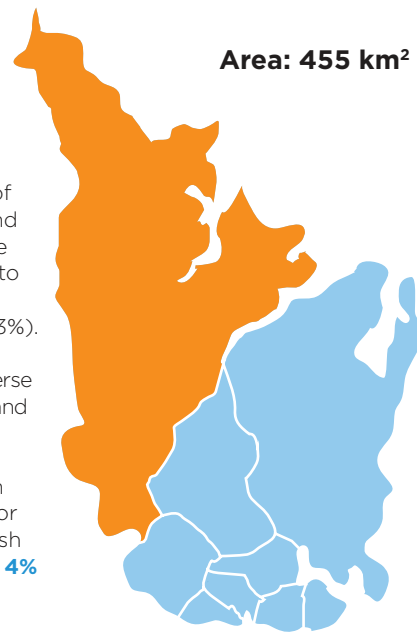
Hornsby LGA has a higher proportion of people culturally and linguistically diverse (32.6%) compared to the SNHN region (29%) and NSW (23%). The largest culturally and linguistically diverse groups are Chinese and Indian.
